Message From Our Principal/CEO

October 2015 Dear Warrior Parents,

The safety of all children attending our school is of the utmost importance to all of us here on staff.

Last month's issue of **WN** spoke of the concerns of staff who handle the morning carpool had regarding speeding, children being released on the driver's side of the car, and the pedestrian crossing. Use of cell phones and cigarette smoking on the campus were also highlighted. We hope you carefully read our concerns and have already modified your behavior. Thank you.

We now need to address a concern for the afternoon carpool pickup. Effective immediately, students will NOT be allowed to leave campus to walk to a parked vehicle on Bullard or Dwyer. We need to know whose car your child is leaving the campus in. We can't do that if someone picks a student up anywhere besides the school's horseshoe driveway. By keeping kids in the gate, we can ensure their safety. The carpool line moves rather quickly, especially when everyone cooperates.

We are also asking that you don't ask the staff to allow students to leave the carpool area to get into a car that pulls up next to the car pool lane. This is a dangerous practice and can cause a child to get hit by cars in the line.

The staff appreciates your understanding and cooperation in this manner.

Uniforms are NOT optional at FCWCS

All Warriors are expected to arrive at school in full uniform each day. The official uniform is as follows:

- Royal Blue polo-styled shirt (with school logo on left chest area) for grades Pre-K 5; Gold polo-styled shirt (with school logo on left chest area) for middle school students;
- **Khaki pants** for boys and girls or khaki skirt/ jumper for girls; students wearing shorts should be attired in shorts reaching the top of the knees;
- Belt (black) for boys and girls;
- White or black socks, socks should cover the ankles (no footies or ankle socks);
- New for this year Black, white, or a combination of black & white shoes; shoes with shoelaces are to be tied at all times. No shoes with wheels or flashing lights permitted on campus. The correct uniform shoe must be worn from the first day of school to the last.
- Outer Wear should be only royal blue or official Fannie C. Williams sweaters, jackets, or sweatshirts if they are to be worn inside the building. Students wearing outer wear of other colors will be asked to remove these items inside of the building.
- Undershirts must be solid black or white only.
- Shirts are to be tucked in at all times.

Non-Acceptable Articles of Clothing

Hoods and hats (inside the building); earrings on male students (females earrings should be studs or nickel-sized); string/rubber bracelets or support bands; nose rings or visible body piercings; any color hair accessories other than white, black, royal blue, or gold; any colored hair extensions; key chains/wallets hanging from the waist; make-up; bandanas, "snapbacks," or caps; non-prescribed glasses or sun glasses; more than one ring. ###

October 2015 Dear Parents,

Would you believe the flu season is upon us? In the United States winter means flu season. It can occur as early as October and already has in the metro area. Peak season is December through February.

Now is the time to get those flu shots. It takes about two weeks (14 days) for your body to build the immunity needed to fight off the viruses that can invade it and make you feel miserable for 7-10 days. Vaccinations can protect your child against the flu viruses that research believes will be the most prevalent this season. Everyone 6 months and older should be vaccinated. Remember, a sick child can't learn.

What are the symptoms of the flu? The flu may include the following: fever or feeling feverish/chills, a cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, body or muscle aches, headaches, tiredness, vomiting and diarrhea (usually in children). Now is the time for those protective vaccinations. Keep our Warriors healthy. ###

Parents of Car Riders: Effective Immediately . . .




Warriors Are Prepared and Productive Pencils for Sale!


