On Wednesday, November 9th, 10 FCWCS students performed in concert with the Louisiana Philharmonic Orchestra at the West Jefferson High School Auditorium.

They performed "New World Symphony" by Antonin Dvorak (1841-1904) on recorders—plastic, flute-like, woodwind instruments used by many band directors for beginner band classes. Fingering is similar to other woodwinds—flutes, piccolos, and clarinets. Learning this instrument

helps to facilitate student's ability to achieve musical literacy (ability to read music). They are presently being employed in the best elementary level General Music Class curriculums, including FCW Charter.

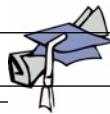

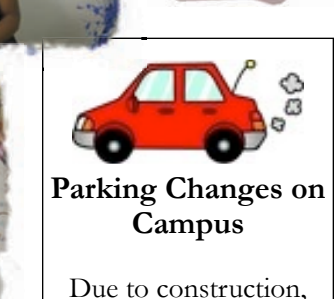


High School Fair Night Goes Over Big With 8th Graders & Parents

Encourage your child to eat breakfast each morning . . . it's important!

The School Breakfast Program is open to open to all children at FCW Charter School. About 75% of all schools in the USA who serve lunch also serve breakfast.

Household income determines if a child is eligible to receive free or reduced meals. To receive free breakfast, household income must be at or below 130 percent of the federal poverty level; for reduced price, income must be between 130 and 185 percent of the poverty level (for the 2009-2010 school year, 130 percent of the poverty level was \$23,803 per year for a family of three; 185 percent for a family of three is \$33,874 per year). Studies show that students who eat breakfast each morning do better in school. It has a positive impact on their reading and math scores as well as improving their speed and memory in cognitive tests.

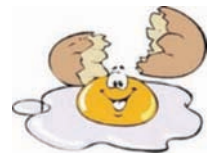
Research also indicates that students who eat breakfast at school—closer to class and test-taking time—perform better on standardized tests than those who skip breakfast or eat breakfast at home.

There is also evidence that children who eat breakfast are less likely to be overweight, and have improved eating habits—they eat more fruits, drink more milk, and consume a wider variety of food types. Schools also seem to have fewer discipline problems and visits to the school nurse when students eat breakfast.

Approximately 1/4 of the daily recommended levels of key nutrients that a child needs are served in the morning meal at school. Breakfast is required to provide no more than 30% of calories from fat and less than 10% of calories from saturated fat.

Parents are also asked to reinforce the notion that food should not be thrown away. Many of older students come into the cafeteria and eat very little. How wasteful! Please remind your child how fortunate they are to have a meal.

Breakfast begins at 7:30 a.m. for Warriors in grades 4-8. Car riders must be on time to partake in the breakfast program. Grades Pre-K through 3 are taken to the cafeteria by their classroom teacher. Make sure they are on time to eat the day's most important meal.
