Message from Our Principal January 8, 2012

Dear Parents of FCW Charter

If you've been on campus recently, I'm sure you've notice how the new building is progressing.

It's moving-it is about 1/3 complete at this point. Each day a little more is finished on our new building. We are making inroads in the classroom in the same manner as the construction crew outside our windows. Each day our students are a little more ahead than they were the day before.

However, occasionally we hit a snag, just as it happens in construction. Lessons have to be re-taught, students are absent, inclement weather disrupts our plans-the unexpected. It happens in the construction industry, at school, and I'm sure, at your home.

But we are a resilient group-you have to be if you teach or are a parent. You bounce back. Those

lessons that need re-teaching, the staff handles. But sometimes students need a little extra TLC (tender loving care) and that's where our Saturday Warrior Academy comes into play!

This is our 5th year of providing small group sessions for our students needing that extra academic push. For nine (9) weeks this winter, FCWCS staff will tutor students, in grades 3 through 8, who need intervention to see them become successful for the upcoming spring testing known as LEAP and iLEAP. Letters have gone home inviting students to attend these sessions. It is important you return them indicating your willingness for your child to spend two hours Saturday mornings with us from January 21-March 31 (with two weeks off for Mardi Gras).

Saturday mornings, from 9:00 a.m.-11:00 a.m., students and teachers will work diligently to take our Warriors over the top to SUCCESS. Parental involvement is needed in providing



We refer to these expectations as the **4Ps** and we spend the first few weeks of school teaching this concept to all students. As the new calendar for 2012 appears, we again reinforce this concept. We refer to it as learning "the culture of Fannie C. Williams Charter School."

Visit a classroom at FCWCS and you will find the **4Ps** displayed on the classroom's wall. They are the basis of our school-wide discipline plan in our school community. All students should exhibit the **4Ps** of Warrior Behavior, whether at school or at school functions, such as field trips or athletic events.




