Dear Parents,

My last month's message spoke of the strong possibility that FCWCS would return to Orleans Parish School Board (aka New Orleans Public Schools) supervision.

The decision has been finalized. We will remain under the auspices of the Recovery School District (RSD) for the foreseeable future. Therefore, we will enter the 2016-2017 with a renewed charter from the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) and under the continued guidance of the RSD.

FCWCS was granted a Type 5 charter back in December 2010. On a cold day in December, we broke ground on this building and received the vote of confidence to operate as Fannie C. Williams Charter School, under the auspices of Community Leaders Advocating Student Success (C.L.A.S.S.), our Board of Directors. This school term saw the renewal of that charter for another six years.

Our mission remains the same—"to achieve the highest academic success through the collaboration of staff, parents, and community." You have entrusted your child(ren) to our care. We are constantly developing that "village" from the old African proverb ("it takes a village to raise a child") to develop the entire child—emotionally, physically, culturally, and of course, academically.

We hope you continue to have faith in our mission and our tenacity to see that the mission is carried out. As always, we appreciate your vote of confidence.





Preparing for 2016-2017

Enrolling Process Has Begun!

Round 1 has ended for the annual enrollment process called OneApp. Expect the results the week of April 4th, via US mail. Round 2 begins on April 18, when the application launches.

By now, all our 8th graders should have several apps in place for their 9th grade year. The application allows students to submit the app for up to eight (8) schools, in order of their preferences. Those 8th graders who followed these directives will receive their placement for the 2016-2017 school year the week of April 4, 2016.

Parents wishing to get a Kindergarten or Pre-K student here next year, should have also taken action in Round 1 Pre-K spots are very limited. We have only 40 seats at FCWCS for Pre-K. Do you have a neighbor or relative trying to get a child into FCWCS? Now is the time to tell them about the oneApp process.

Round 2 logistics are as follows:

Week of April 18: Application Launched; May 6: Early Window Deadline; May 27: Standard Window Deadline; Week of June 27: Results Available. Parents needing to begin registration for new students should go to one of three Family Resource Centers to begin. The centers are as follows:
