

The school calendar for 2016-2017 reflects 68,648 minutes of instructional time (169.5 days). The state requirement is 63,720 minutes FCWCS exceeds the state requirement by 4,928 minutes (12 days).

Each day represents almost 7 hours of learning. Students exceeding the state requirement (155.5 days) are subject to repeat the grade, regardless of their Grade Point Average. Poor attendance will result in the school's social worker and possibly the court system becoming involved. ###

School Enrollment Remains Steady

As of September 8th, 609 students call FCWCS their educational home. 309 families have shown confidence in our mission. We have 315 males and 294 females enrolled. Our students are mostly African American with Hispanic, Asian, and White students adding to the diversity of our campus. ###

Diagnostic testing allows staff to group students by ability. This allows teachers to provide the intervention needed to bring our scholars' skills up to grade level or beyond.



Academic & Behavior Requirements for Participation

FCWCS offers a variety of activities outside the classroom to its student body. We encourage all to participate.

There's the Marching Warriors and Auxiliary Units, flag football, cross country, basketball, volleyball, scouting, and the student council, to name a few. But we must remind students that they are students first—before they are athletes, musicians, dancers, cheerleaders, or school leaders.

These groups are open to students primarily in grades 4-8. This is often the age when some students start to "slack off" academically. Behavior can also become an issue for a minority of pupils. To help maintain academic and behavior standards, Responsibility Trackers have been instituted.

In order for a student to be a part of any extra-curricular activity, they must maintain at least a **75 average** on their responsibility tracker for each quarter. Therefore, if a student is below a 75 average after the first quarter or any subsequent quarter (s)he will be placed on behavior probation.

Probation will allow the student to continue participating in the activity until the next quarter arrives. If the average is still below a 75 after the probationary period has ended, the student will be removed or excluded

from the activity for the remainder of the school year.

Students must also maintain their grades to participate. Students whose grades fall below a **2.0 GPA** (grade point average) will be placed on academic probation. The student

has the opportunity to bring their GPA up and retain their membership in the organization or team. If the GPA does not rise after the probationary period, the student will be removed or excluded from the activity for the remainder of the school year.

Students and parents are reminded that our main purpose is to educate our Warriors.

Extra-curricular is something "extra" or lagniappe as we say it New Orleans. It is *not* the main reason for being here—but it adds so much more to the experience that is



After School Program Underway—Is Your Child Enrolled?

After school care is always a problem for working parents.

Parents with students enrolled at FCWCS can rely on the After School Program here to provide your child with quality activities from 3:15 to 5:15 p.m., Monday through Thursday. Students can be involved in sports (basketball, cross country, flag football), arts & crafts, dance team, cheerleading, drill teams, and music). Assistance is also given with homework for the first 45 minutes of the two hour program (parents are reminded that they should review

homework to see if it has been completed).

A snack is provided also. A non-refundable \$20.00 registration fee for each child enrolled is needed. This fee covers the entire school year.

Bus transportation home is provided. All students are eligible to attend, Pre-K-8, but parents of students in Pre-K through 3 must meet them at the bus stop. Participants are not allowed to ride the 3:15 p.m. bus once registered in the After School Program.

Application and fee must be submitted before your child is allowed to stay. ###
