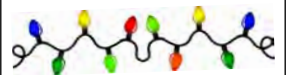

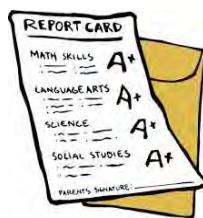

Junior Saints Training Camp Returns

The New Orleans Saints/Gatorade Junior Training Camp visited FCWCS on Wed., November 2nd. This marks the camp's 4th visit to the Warrior Campus.



The Saints Training Camp visits local elementary and middle schools, targeting students in grades 3-8. The clinics last about an 1.5 hours.

Students begin the session with an introduction to the camp and its purpose, plus the rules. Students then move out to the school's yard where the activities and fun begin.

They are placed into groups and each group rotates through five or six non-contact stations with football skills and movement as the criteria. The stations were designed so that anybody can handle the skills regardless of age, gender, or athletic ability. The goal is to get everybody active!

Thanks to our librarian, Mrs. K. LeBlanc, for coordinating this event with the New Orleans Saints. The Saints receive more than 100 requests for this activity yearly. They travel as far east as Pensacola, Florida to present this activity to school kids. Mrs. LeBlanc always works diligently to ensure Warriors are treated to this special event.

Instructional Day Begins at 8:00 am SHARP!

Students arriving after 8:00 am are considered late and will be marked tardy. All tardies are counted as unexcused, unless the student has a note from a doctor/dentist, has attended a funeral of an immediate family member, has participated in a school sponsored event, or the school bus was late or did not arrive at the stop to pick them up.

Students should arrive at school no earlier than 7:30 am

Teachers begin their morning duty at 7:30 am, therefore, no student should be on campus before 7:30 am. This is a dangerous practice

that we don’t encourage. Parents are asked not to drop scholars off before 7:30 am, unless you will be waiting with them. **Breakfast is served from 7:30 am until 7:55 am.** Students arriving after 7:55 am will miss the opportunity to partake in the breakfast program.

School Ends at 3:15 pm

The school day at FCWCS ends at 3:15 pm daily—unless your child is enrolled in the AfterSchool Program. **The After School Program ends at 5:15 pm Monday through Thursday and at 3:15 pm on Friday.** ###

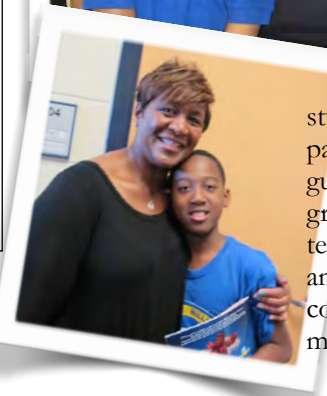

Season Concludes for XC

It takes a special kind of athlete to run Cross Country. Not a sport to attract a lot of spectators on a Saturday morn at 7:30 am. Those viewing are usually parents and coaches, cheering on these dedicated runners.

Cross Country is a competitive sport where individuals and teams run a foot race over natural terrain such as dirt or grass. In XC (abbreviation for Cross Country) everyone competes—however the first seven runners to finish are considered the scoring team.

Most Warriors on campus would be hard pressed to explain XC competition if asked. But that's okay. Coach Dana Clark-Williams found a group of Warrior Athletes who seem to be as passionate about XC and running as she is.

This year's Cross Country team competed in a total of six meets and ended the 2016 season by participating in the Metro Middle School League's Championship on Saturday, October 8, 2016.
