Parents are you familiar with HPV?

Protect your teen . . .

The medical community is advocating vaccinating girls and boys starting at age 11-12 years old or as soon as possible for the Human Papillomavirus or HPV.

Reasons cited to vaccinate youngsters are:

1. HPV can cause cervical, anal and mouth/throat cancer.
2. All three doses develop immune response before one becomes sexually active.
3. Increased vaccination rates decrease risk of exposure.
4. It's safe: the CDC and FDA monitor and no serious safety concerns are associated with the vaccine.

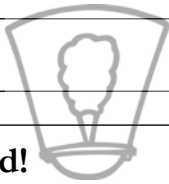
50-59% of girls and 40-49% of boys in Louisiana are vaccinated.

17,500 women and 9,300 men are affected by HPV related cancers each year in the USA.

This is a topic worthy of a serious discussion with your child's physician. Your doctor can provide more information about the vaccines. It is recommended for preteens (11-12 years) and teens.

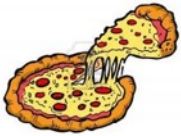

A school in Portugal has a sign that has gone viral on Facebook. The sign has asked the timeless question: **where does a school's responsibilities begin, and where do they end?**

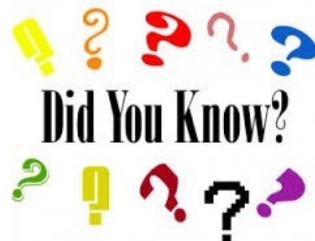

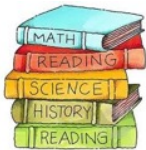
