



Parents, Guardians: Did you know that . . .

Students who have Doctor's orders and whose parents have completed the Louisiana State policy/ protocol for administration of medication in school can only receive their medication by the medication trained staff.

No medications (prescription or over-the-counter) can be given by school personnel until all the requirements of the policy and regulation are met. A parent or guardian may come to the school and administer medication to their child during the school day. Medications can not be accepted by the classroom teacher. If a student brings medication to school, it must be picked up in the front office by a parent. ###



As of September 5th, 577 students are enrolled at FCWCS. About 310 families have enrolled here. There are 301 males and 277 female students (577 total). Our students are predominately African American, with Hispanic, Asian, and students of European descent adding to our diverse campus. ###

Attendance Counts

All students can learnbut they must be present to do so!

In order to be eligible for promotion, students will need to be in attendance a minimum of 158 days out of the 163 days in the school year. After the 3rd day absent, your child's teacher will reach out to the parent to discover what the problem is. Teachers will contact the school's social worker Mrs. Aziz if the problem is not resolved.




