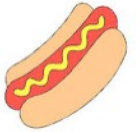
Classroom Instruction Begins Daily at 8:00 am. Students arriving after this time will be considered late and will be marked tardy.

If you plan on celebrating your child's birthday in their classroom, you must arrange seven (7) days in advance with the classroom teacher and the principal. If the date requested interferes with instruction, the request can be denied. ###



CAO Williams-Pryer has reviewed the academic rolls . . .

Chief Academic Officer Williams-Pryer has informed all students and parents that students involved in band, marching units, athletic teams, etc., must maintain a **2.0 GPA** to be academically eligible to participate in extra-curricular activities. Our scholars should remember that their main reason for being here is to acquire an education.

Students were notified of their academic standing the week of **October 23rd**. Students who have GPA's less than 2.0 are on academic probation. They will have until the end of the 1st Semester (December 21st) to bring their grades up to 2.0.

Students not reaching the 2.0 by the distribution of the 1st Semester report cards on January 10th will be dismissed from their extra-curricular team or organization (see pg. 11 of the FCWCS Family Handbook for more info). ###

Differential Computerized Instruction

Our school uses the computer programs illustrated through their logos above and below this message. It is referred to as Differential Computerized Instruction, aka DI.

According to Michael Petrillin in EducationNext (Winter 2011), "With the advent of powerful online learning tools . . . students . . . receive instruction that's truly individualized to their own needs—differentiation on steroids."

We use technology software that differentiates instruction and are correlated to the state standards (common core), provides assessments (testing), and provides different skill levels. We are experiencing success, especially with I-Ready (reading and math instruction).

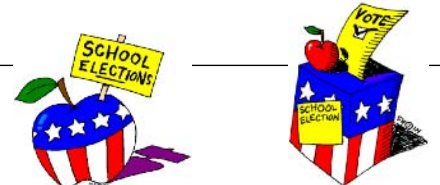
