



Dear Parents/Guardians,

Did you remember to re-register your child with us? A registration packet was sent home in late April requesting it to be completed and returned back to school. You were requested to send: current immunization records, parent/guardian identification, and proofs of residency (2).

Also, this upcoming year, we will have a technology fee and a budget for Pre-K and Kindergarten students. The technology fee of \$10.00 is for students in grades 1 through 8. Pre-K and Kindergarten students are assessed a fee of \$60.00. Pre-K fee covers field trips. Kindergarten \$60.00 fee covers the end of year activities. These fees are payable in cash or money orders only. Registration fees are due by May 16th.
