We Always Need Updated Contact Information!

Remember: keep the main office updated regarding your contact information. Please don't change your number, home address, or e-mail without letting us know.

It is very important that we can reach you in an emergency—for example, medical personnel (EMS) don't like to handle minors unless a parent has given authority to do so. We also use our "robo-call" system to contact you in the case of an unexpected school closing due to weather or civil emergencies, etc. (in the last three years we have experienced a tornado, the unexpected closing of school twice due to

hurricanes, tropical storms, and frigid weather conditions). Maybe the school bus returned your child to school—we can't call you to let you know your scholar is safe if we don't have your current number. We love to give our parents a heads up when we can—but we must have current contact information.

Help keep our records up-to-date! Use the sample form below as a guide to what information is needed and on a sheet of paper write the requested info and send back to school or come into the office and fill out a form there. Information regarding the Bank at School Program was sent home for parents to enroll their child in the savings account program. This is our second year partnering with the Hancock Whitney Bank on Read Blvd.

The application needs to be completed with important personal info for both the custodial parent and the minor's (student's) information for participants. Parents may sign their scholar up on September 11th, during the 4 pm - 6 pm Parent-Teacher Conferences. The account remains free of service charges until the child turns 18.

The second Wednesday of each month will be Hancock Whitney Wednesday at FCWCS. This will take place from September through May. Students can bring their deposits to school and reps from HW will handle the transaction. Cash deposits will be limited to \$25.00 and coin deposits will be limited to \$10.00. Checks to be deposited are at an unlimited amount.

Hancock Whitney Wednesday will be on the following dates for 2019-2020 at 1:00 pm: Sept. 11th (4pm - 6pm), Oct. 9th, Dec. 11th, Jan. 8th, Feb. 12th, Mar. 11th, Apr. 8th, and May 13th.

New Bus Service Vendor Chosen

FCWCS has selected a new bus vendor for the current school year. In order to keep costs down, we have teamed with two other schools. The bus service is **B & L Transportation,** a third-party vendor.

All rules & regulations regarding student behavior on the bus is still in place. Disruptive behavior is unsafe and therefore, not permitted. Parents and students should have received their copy of the Warrior Way for 2019-2020, the bus contract regarding student behavior on the school bus during the trips to and from school, athletic events, and field trips.

It is as follows:

Way 1-Pre-K students are to sit in the first seats, followed by kindergarten and so on; Way 2-Girls will be seated behind the driver and boys will be on the passenger side of the bus;

Way 3-Parents will be given fair warning of impending bus suspensions;

Way 4—Major incidents, such as fighting, disrespect toward authority, or serious horse playing that could result in injury will merit one (1) week suspension from the bus—without warning.

The transportation of the suspended child with the responsibility of the parent. A child missing school because alternative transportation could not be secured is considered "unexcused."

FCWCS Implements New Lunch Option

FCWCS takes part in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs.

This year we have been chosen to provide free lunch and breakfast to all students at no charge to our families. No paperwork is required to be submitted and all students will be eligible to receive breakfast and lunch without having to pay a fee or submit a meal application. This is part of the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP).

Same as last year, our meals are prepared by private vendor Fresh Food Factor (in conjunction with Volunteers of America). Breakfast is served daily in the Warrior Café from 7:20 am to 7:50 am.

Parents are reminded that fast food of any kind, is not allowed in the school's cafeteria. This is a violation of the federal government's rules regarding their breakfast and lunch program.

Breakfast and lunch menus for the month can be found on the school's website (fcwcs.org). Please provide your child with a bag lunch from home if the meal for any given day is not something your child eats.
