October 2019 Dear Parents/Guardians,

As part of our Board of Directors (C.L.A.S.S.) and the school's administration efforts to keep you informed, my message this month is in regards to the charter renewal process for the 2021-2022 school year.

Our school, Fannie C. Williams Charter, will be in the renewal cycle in two years (2021-2022). NOLA Public Schools will also reach out to you soon to notify you of this important item on our upcoming calendar.

When we first started as a charter, we were governed by the Recovery School District. As of July 1, 2018, all charter schools are under NOLA Public Schools (OPSB). As part of our New Orleans Public School System, all charter schools participate in a routine evaluation process during the last year of their charter operating agreement, which is usually referred to as "renewal." The operating agreement is between the school's charter governing board (C.L.A.S.S.) and the Orleans Parish School Board.

The OPSB will use the Charter School Accountability Framework as the foundation to make its decision regarding our renewal. There will also be a review as to how well we have compiled with federal, state, local laws and policy. Our school performance score (SPS–56.2, D) will also be paramount in this renewal effort.





I know there are many who proudly profess each year that they do not get flu shots. That's quite a gamble. The flu is a disease that infects the respiratory tract. In the US, we have more than 3 million cases per year. It is transmitted through the air, but can be prevented by the vaccine. So your chances of being infected are great.

You will never forget the seven days or so you will spend with the flu! Your case may be mild to severe. The flu can cause death—especially in the very young and the elderly *(continues on page 9).*







How will you know you have the flu? You will begin to feel bad rather quickly, instead of gradually like a cold. You will probably have a high fever, headache, muscle aches, coughing, a sore throat, and extreme fatigue. Some individuals will even experience nausea or vomiting, a stuffy nose and the chills. Expect this to last at least five days. It will take your body several weeks to feel normal again.

Is it possible to get the flu after taking the shot? Yes, but it is often not as severe as it would be if you had not been immunized at all. There are many strains of the flu. Doctors immunize according to which version they think will be the most prevalent for this flu season. So you can have been inoculated for a version that was not part of this year's vaccine. But remember, your odds are that you will not suffer as severely if you had the flu shot.

#### Why is winter considered the flu season?

We spend more time in close quarters (inside) with each other during colder months. The flu can be spread by being near someone coughing or sneezing and sending virus-filled droplets into the air you breath. You can also touch something—door handles, computers, chairs, etc. that someone who has the disease touched. You then put your hands into your nose, eyes or mouth and now you got it! That is why we stress the importance of washing hands and/or sanitizing hands to our Warriors on campus.

Let's keep everybody healthy this season. Take the entire family to the drug store or the doctor and get them immunized. The shots are free with insurance (private or SNAP). Healthy children learn better!
