Dear Warrior Parents

As the school nurse, it is my responsibility to keep our school family healthy. Healthy children can learn!

At the start of the school year, I sent home notices for students who were in need of vaccinations (shots). Parents must sign to give their permission for the shots to be administered at school. If this document is not returned, we can not inoculate your child. Students who are not in compliance with their shots will have to remain home until their parents can get their vaccinations handled.

Please ensure that all needed childhood vaccinations are taken care of so that your scholar does not miss any important days of instruction. Remember, vaccines help to curtail widespread epidemics—smallpox, polio, diphtheria, measles, rubella, and mumps. These childhood diseases may seem to be a thing of the past only because most parents are in compliance with the immunization shots needed to stop them from becoming part of our memories again. 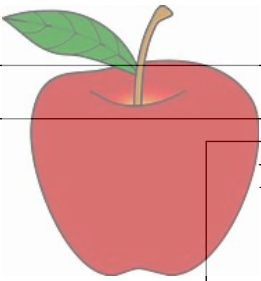

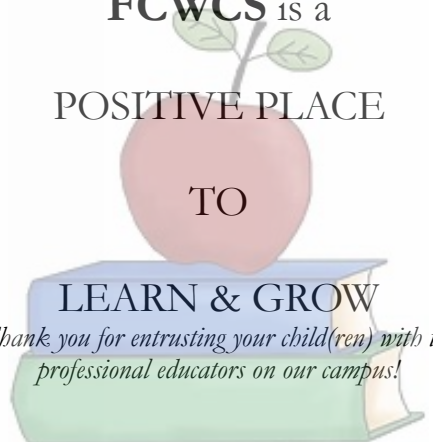

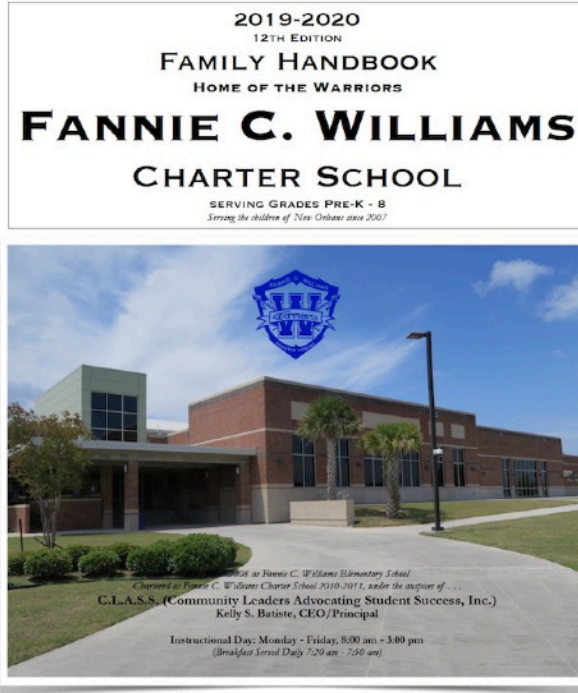

We've Got A Lending Library!

Our school library has about 5000 books in its collection. Most of these were gifts to the school after Hurricane Katrina by the Laura Bush Foundation.

Many of our students in grades 1-4 visit the library weekly with their teachers. They have been instructed by librarian LeBlanc on how to select the best book for their reading skills, the proper care of the book, and how to check it out and return it to the circulation desk. It is our hope that this develops a love of reading and books in all students.

Students are allowed to borrow one book per week from FCWCS's library. Books are due back on the same day the following week. Parents must grant written permission for their child to borrow from the school's library.

Parents can also help to motivate their child(ren) into developing a love of reading by bringing them to one of the city's 15 public libraries, located in all sections of the city.

The closest public library to our campus is the East New Orleans Regional Library at 5641 Read Blvd. You can borrow books, music, and movies. It is open seven days a week and it is free—all you need is a library card! ###



Finding just the right book can sometimes be a challenge for these lower elementary students. Sometimes it takes a little help from your teacher or on other occasions, searching on

your own can be just the thing! Classroom trips average 30 minutes per visit and students will return the books one week later on their follow up trip to FCWCS's lending library.

What's Happening in the Classroom

Achieve 3000 is a game-based literacy computer program that has been customized for the state of Louisiana and is presently being used on our campus.

Students begin the year with an assessment of their current level of reading ability. The assessment then charts where their expected growth should reach. This platform provides our reading and English language arts teachers the ability to provide differentiated instruction to each student. The program has been purchased to increase the reading and comprehension skills of students in grades 3-8.

Emphasis is placed on sight words, vocabulary, fluency, and phonemic awareness.

FCWCS has been registered to participate in Achieve's 3K's Read to Succeed Contest. All teachers are encouraging students to participate. The winning class will earn a gift card to spend on a class party. To earn points, students must complete a multiple choice activity and score 75% or higher. To be eligible to win, 75% of the class must take part in the contest and must complete at least eight multiple choice activities during the contest period of November 4th through December 6th. ###

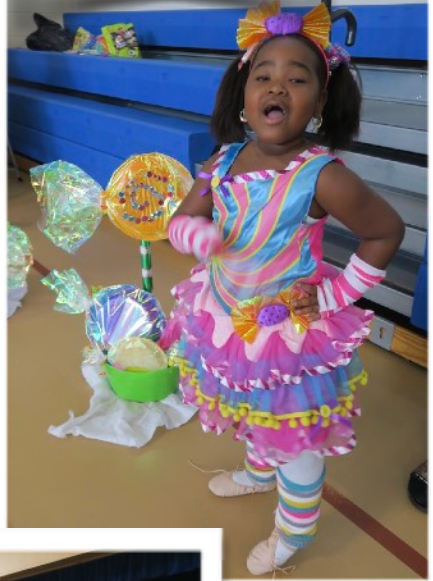

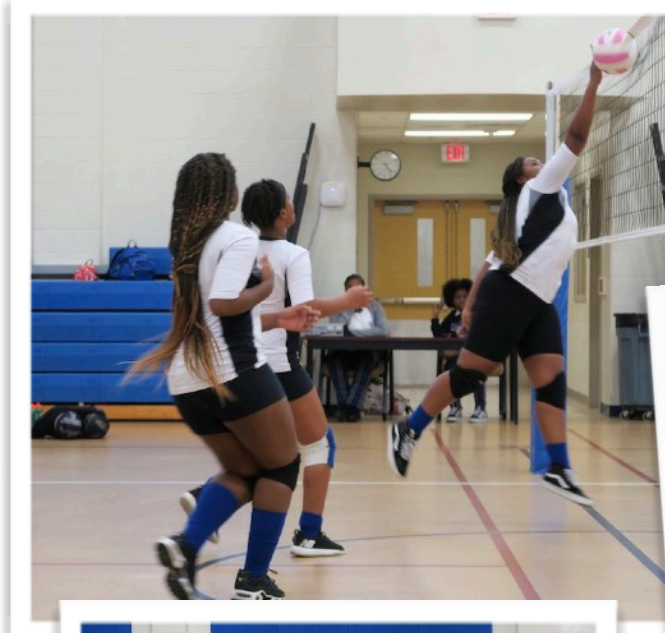

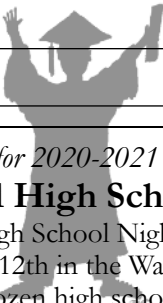
