Principal's Message

April 30, 2020

Dear Parents/Guardians

Wow! Do we miss our students. I'm in contact with staff and that sentiment resounds from all conversations with the educators at FCWCS.

Please continue to keep them safe—teach the following three points: practice social distancing (6 feet or more), wash hands often (20 seconds or better) and stay at home.

I know that you are attempting to assist your scholars in their paper and online lessons. Make every effort to keep them engaged academically for two or three hours per day. These assignments will be used for students' fourth quarter grades and are critical for their academic growth. Reach out to your child's teacher if you or your child have any questions or concerns regarding assignments. Please allow them to participate regularly.

It is with great regrets that we are unable to commemorate with a formal program, our 8th Graders and Kindergarten students on their journey to the next grade. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, this is not doable this Spring. The administration found this a very difficult decision to make, but we must first ensure the safety of everyone involved. **Refunds will be provided to parents who have paid any fees toward these events. The University of Holy Cross is a private liberal arts college located on the west bank in Algiers, Louisiana. It is affiliated with the Roman Catholic Church (Marianites of Holy Cross, Catholic nuns/sisters). It is formerly known as Our Lady of Holy Cross College. Located on a 16-acre campus in a residential neighborhood, it presently has over 1200 students studying more than 50 undergraduate and graduate programs. Are you struggling with life during this pandemic? Need someone to talk to ?

At the **University of Holy Cross**, students pursuing doctorate and master's degrees are offering free tele-counseling for people challenged by the current social distancing and isolation situation. Students will be doing the counseling sessions from a HIPAA-complaint software on their individual laptops. from 11 a.m. to 8 p.m. daily at (504) 398-2168. They may expand hours based on demand.

UHC doctoral students are licensed as counselors. Master's students are supervised by faculty because they are not yet fully licensed. If a master's student runs into an issue, he or she can add a faculty supervisor to the session.
