

We cannot wait until the day of testing to accomplish this task. When you bring the Chromebook, make sure you have the charger also. Use the school's front entrance, 8 am - 2 pm. to get this done.





FYI (for your information) . . .

What body temperature will warrant a student or adult's removal from school?

Any student or adult entering the building must have their temperature taken. Anyone having a temperature of 100.4° will not be allowed on campus.

Employees will return home. Car riders will return home with their parents (that's why their temps are taken **before** their parents leave the campus).

Bus riders temps are taken upon entering the building. If the temperature is 100.4° or greater, they are placed alone in the isolation room and the temperature is retaken in 30 minutes with another type of device. They will be asked if they have been in contact with anyone has had a fever, were coughing, etc., (hopefully, the answer will be no). If it is still high, parents will be notified and they will have to come and pick them up immediately. Students will have to remain home until the fever subsides.





Karen LeBlanc, Librarian/Art Enrichment Teacher For the last 13 years our Librarian has been Karen LeBlanc. LeBlanc replaced Mrs. S. Wilson, who retired in May 2009. Mrs. LeBlanc followed her during the 2009-2010 school year.

Can't place Mrs. LeBlanc? She's our artist-in-residence, the talented lady who provides the fantastic props (along with Mr. Philip Britt) seen during the Black History Program, High School Night, the Christmas Program, Grandparent's Day, Muffins for Mom, Donuts with Dad, 8th Grade Culminating Activity, Kindergarten Graduation and let's not forget the twice yearly Scholastic Book Fair!

Those Book Fair displays spill out into the hallways of the first floor, always following the themes of the Book Fair.

LeBlanc is a Dillard University graduate, having earned a Bachelor's of Art in Criminal Justice. She did not set out to become an educator, but the calling began with tutoring kids while in elementary school through her high school years (she's a grad of F. T. Nicholls, now known as Frederick Douglass High).

Working with young people has always found a way into her career path. Her first job out of college was working with youngsters in state custody. She moved on to run an after school program with New Orleans Outreach Program at Robert McNair Elementary.

She decided to pursue certification in education when Hurricane Katrina hit in '05. LeBlanc and family moved to Clarksville, Tennessee where she continued to work with students on the Fort Campbell Military Base.

She returned home to New Orleans and became the school's librarian, Enrichment Art Teacher, and surrogate mom to many here on campus.

This school year, she and fellow art instructor Britt have stepped their game up. She spends countless hours looking for projects for their enrichment art students to complete—in class and those who are working from home as distant learners!

*LeBlanc and Britt where chosen Para and Teacher of the Year for the 2017-2018 school year. It was well-deserved.

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

- 7. Try to make the morning a pleasant one. Do not add to your child's stress.
- 8. Remind your child to listen carefully to the instructions from the teacher and to read the directions and each question carefully.
- 9. Encourage your child to stay focus on the test, even if other students finish early.

ALL LEAP 22025 tests will be computer based. To prepare the school devices for testing, all students' Chromebooks should be returned to Fannie C. Williams Charter School by Friday, April 23rd.

All students should leave all backpacks and electronic devices (cell phones and smart watches) at home on testing days. Students may dress down the week of testing. Attire must be appropriate for school.






