# School Uniforms, NO Change for 2021-2020


Principal Batiste has informed the WN that the current uniform will remain unchanged for the next academic year. Parents can review the school's website, listing the official plaid (No. 88) for females and grey pants for males.

All students are required to follow the uniform policy, appearing the **first day** (August 9, Grades 1-8; August 16, Pre-K & Kdg.) in full uniform.

The entire uniform (sweaters, blouses and shirts with school emblem, etc.) can be purchased at **LOGO**  EXPRESS @ 3141 Gentilly Blvd. YOUNG FASHIONS @ 5700 Crowder Blvd. is a good option for bottoms—skirts, pants, jumpers and grey slacks for boys.

All blouses and shirts should have the school's logo on the left side.

# Leila S. Robinson, 1st Grade Paraprofessional

Our Ms. Robinson has a teaching career that spans over four decades. We call that a "seasoned" educator. You can tell by her demeanor that she has spent years honing her craft. Her days are spent at FCW as a paraprofessional but her career in education began as a 1st grade and kindergarten classroom teacher.

Ms. Robinson's career began at neighboring Mildred Osborne Elementary. In 1983, she moved to McDonogh #32 in Algiers as a Kindergarten teacher and later a Pre-K teacher. During this time, Ms. Rob worked to write a quality curriculum, find creative and modern techniques to engage her students, mentored new teachers, and opened her classroom for observation to other interested educators. In 1997, she was awarded Teacher of the Year for her many years of dedication and advocacy for quality education. Her career at McDonogh #32 ended in 2005 with Hurricane Katrina.

After Katrina, she was employed again in the charter school system at Martin Behrman Charter School in Algiers. She retired in 2015.

In the Fall of 2017, Ms. Robinson accepted a paraprofessional position in first grade at Fannie C. Williams Charter School. You will find her floating from the rooms of Ms. Theard and Mrs. Bercy effortlessly. During the 2018-2019 school year, her co-workers at Fannie noted her talents and named her Staff Member of the Year!

What makes a good teacher/paraprofessional? You only have to watch Ms. Robinson in action to know the answer to that question! She's patient, engaging, a great collaborator, a great listener, adaptable, and empathic toward all the little ones she helps. It is obvious her goal is to create a community of learners that are being nurtured to grow in a positive and fun environment. The two 1st grade teachers she assist—Theard and Bercy—I am sure have learned a thing or two from this veteran educator. We can also add to her list of attributes that she shares her best practices honed during those four decades.

A native of Natchez, Mississippi, Ms. Robinson holds a B.A. in Elementary Education from Xavier University and a Master's in Curriculum & Instruction from the University of New Orleans. Her inspiration came from her mother, who was an educator and encouraged the path into the career that has shaped her adult life.

When not encouraging our first graders to grow, Ms. Robinson enjoys gardening, reading and traveling with her family.

Our culture tells us that summer "should" include combinations of the following:

Fun, family time, leisure, sun, rest, camp, travel, swimming, picnics, reading, beach, smiles, etc.

But the daily reality of summer may look more like:

Work, juggling, boredom, time apart, moving, expenses, stress, sweating, change, more of the usual, conflict, decisions, etc.

Perhaps your picture of summer contains elements from both lists, plus others. As the summer approaches, how can we meet all of our desires for the summer, while at the same time cope with all of the realities?

## **Summer Survival Tips**

It may help, as a parent, to try to employ some of the following summer survival strategies.

#### Time Together

Plan shared time together as a family. Whether it is a weeklong family vacation or a weekend picnic at a nearby park, time away from the everyday stresses of home and work can be used as valuable time to unite your family.

Feeling connected to something beyond themselves lets children know they belong. It is one of the conditions necessary for a child to develop a positive sense of selfesteem.

#### Play

Recognize the need to play! Remember summers as a child when it seemed like all you did was play and swim and play some more? As adults, we forget that we can and should still play, especially with our children. The longer days of summer almost beg us to get outdoors and be together.

Even if you are not the type to ride a bike or play ball with your children, challenge yourself to find a way to "let go" and "go play!" Resources and ideas are available in local bookstores, online, or better yet, from your kids!!

#### Laugh

Remember to laugh! Many times, we can lighten up a situation with humor when we are tempted to "lose it." A positive sense of humor helps us to keep things in perspective and works as an antidote to the drudgery, feeling of endlessness, and conflict that can arise during the long days of summer.

**WARNING:** A healthy family is one that is able to laugh *with* one another and not *at* one another. Become aware of the difference between fun and positive laughter verses ridicule or sarcasm that can be hurtful. Unless all parties find the joking to be funny, the comments may have crossed the line into the hurtful.

#### Watch for Stress

Be alert for symptoms of stress in your family. As summer unfolds, observe behavior. Are family members feeling harried, short tempered, distracted, tense? Are your earlier expectations about summer not meshing with the day-to-day reality? Step back and ask yourself, "What's happening here and how can we get ourselves under control?"

**WARNING:** It can take time for some children *and* adults to adapt to a change in patterns or a lack of routine.

## A Parting Thought

There is no one "right recipe" for summer. Despite what the culture or media may "decide" for us, each of us as parents and as a family need to figure out what works best for us.

May 21, 2021

Public school students will be returning to the classrooms in-person this fall, according to New Orleans Public Schools Superintendent Henderson Lewis, Jr.

The school met last night and voted that the 80 charter schools will be holding classes in the traditional setting of the classroom for all grade levels. Remote or virtual learning will only be offered for special circumstances due to health issues or if students are ordered to quarantine.

NOPS educates 45,000 students. At the close of this school year (May 21), about 20-30% of elementary and middle school scholars were still in the virtual mode of learning. About 50% of high schoolers were being educated remotely.

Warrior parents should prepare to send their scholar to campus in August, in complete uniform with mask daily. Vaccines are available for students 12 and over.

### 2021-2022 Return Student Registration Information

This form was sent home, did you return it? Virtual students parents can come to the main office and receive a copy to fill out and return (visitors are still not allowed in the building, however).

We're hoping ALL our Warriors return next year... We are saving a seat for your child for the 2021-2022 school session! You will need to complete a two page document and supply proof of residency (2) for Orleans Parish. Examples of proof are:

- Utility bill
- Rental or Lease Document
- Property Tax Notice
- Sewerage & Water Board
- Cox Communications Bill

We cannot make copies, so please come with copies we can keep. A complete registration will have you providing the above proof of residency (2) and current ID for yourself (Driver's Lic or State ID).

Remember, if you fill a OneApp to request another school, your seat at FCWCS will considered vacant and may be given to another student, even if you change your mind or don't receive the placement you were seeking.

#### Who needs OneApp?

You should submit OneApp if your child is:

- -NEW to New Orleans or new to public education;
- **–Seeking to transfer** from their current school to a new school for the 2021-2022 school year;
- -A transitional student, which means their current school does not offer their expected grade next year (ALL FCWCS 8th graders advancing to 9th grade (high school) should have completed a OneApp months ago. Those not completing this task will be assigned a school by OneApp!


