

Warriors Return to Campus August 9th





2. The Student Progress Center login screen will be shown.

- If you are a first time user, click **Register a New User**.
- If your account has already been created, type your **Username** and **Password**, and then click Sign In.

Need to Create a New Account?

Enter the requested information:

1. **Relationship** (*this is most likely parent or guardian*);
2. Enter **first name** and **last name** (*should be the parent's or guardian's first and last names*);
3. Enter **PSN Number** (*Student Portal #*). This is a **five digit number** used by the system to verify a parent. You will see the number on the **Student Information Form** sent home by the school;
4. If the information provided in #s1, 2, & 3 above is correct, you will be allowed to create a **login (6-20 characters)** and **password (6-20 characters)**. Fill in the required information. It is strongly suggested you write your login/username and password down and keep it in a secure it in a place to access it if you should forget this information. FCWCS does not have access to your password;
5. You will be asked to answer 2 "secret questions" to help you get into the SPC if you forget your login and password. Good idea to write these down also;
6. Click **SUBMIT** when done. ###

Principal's Message

September 14, 2021

Dear Parents/Guardians,

I am writing this message to you for the second time in two weeks. Before we could go to press, Hurricane Ida happened.

We are regrouping here at FCWCS, just as you are probably doing at your home. Please bear with us for the changes that will be needed to adjust the school calendar to make up the more than two weeks of school that we have missed.

Today was the first day that staff returned to school since August 27th. Our doors were opened for students and staff to take COVID-19 testing to ensure we are re-opening school as safely as possible. FCWCS was one of 91 school sites providing the high quality, molecular tests. More than 188 staff and students took advantage of the three hour testing drive.


The staff at FCWCS is 93.8% vaccinated. We are doing all we can to keep your child(ren) safe and sound. We know you are doing all you can to help us on your end. We appreciate your effort. This year is definitely a team effort—that 'village' we hear so much about ('It takes a village to raise a child').

As I pen this, the FDA (Federal Drug Administration) has recently announced it has approved the Pfizer COVID-19 Vaccine. That means, for individuals 16 years of age and older it will bear the same authorization for use as smallpox, measles, diphtheria, chickenpox, whooping cough, hepatitis B, rotavirus, acellular pertussis, polio, mumps, etc. Every parent knows that from birth to age 18, these vaccines are

needed to keep a child healthy. Schools take these vaccinations so seriously—we have a school nurse employed to ensure that all children studying on our campus have shots that are up-to-date. By Halloween, we may have vaccination approval for our students of all ages.

We are living in unprecedented times! Keeping you informed is very important to us. Thank you for reading this. I know it is a lot to digest, but it is important. As always, reach out if you have a question or concern (*see page 2 of this newsletter*). Thanks once again for entrusting the education of your child(ren) to the staff at Fannie C. Williams Charter School.

The Many Faces of FCWCS



Faculty Members to Know

This column is the fourth in a series about the educators who man the classrooms of FCWCS . . .

Deidra P. Barnett

Reading Interventionist/School Site Testing Coordinator

Since the first school year of FCW (2007-2008), Deidra Barnett has been on staff. This marks her 14th year on Bullard Avenue.

Mrs. Barnett is one of two reading interventionists on campus. What exactly does she do in this capacity? Barnett and counterpart, Carla Lewis, are responsible for providing support for student achievement in English Language Arts, with special attention to **reading**. They monitor, report, and communicate student progress and performance to the classroom teacher and parents. We can also count on her to coordinate the state-mandated spring testing each year (LEAP 2025).

Barnett's earliest days as an educator was spent at the uptown Holy Ghost School. She joined the public school system of her hometown at Valena C. Jones for 17 years. There she taught kindergarten and 1st grade.

Barnett received her early education at St. Rita Elementary in the Carrollton section of town. She was the first integrate that school in 1967 (our own Rosa Parks, 1967-1975). After completing St. Rita, she attended high school at Cabrini High on Esplanade Avenue. Of course Xavier University was on her radar to complete her postsecondary studies.

That 'P' in her name stands for Priestly, her maiden name. If you're from the Desire Area, you know of her father, Coach Thomas Priestly of G. W. Carver High School*. He spent 35 years there as a coach (basketball) and teacher. His love for his players/students became Deidra's inspiration to follow in his footsteps. Both parents—mom and dad—instilled in Barnett the drive to always work to become a better person.

If you know Barnett, you know of her patience, love of children, kindness, and empathy for all those around her. You are also keenly aware of her love of the New Orleans Saints. No bigger smile could be found on anybody's face than Barnett's on September 10th. Called to the gym to meet her favorite Saint, Carr Jordan (#94). Jordan made a surprise visit to FCW the morning after a stellar night game on 9th against the Texans (Saints 30, Texans 28).

Besides Saints football, what are some of Barnett's passions? She's loves gardening and college football. I didn't ask, but I image Fall and Winter would be her favorite times of the year! I also know Deidra loves to cook (she's a good one if I remember correctly). Loves entertaining and Jazz Fest!

Thank Mrs. Barnett for all you do! We're a better place because you're here!



Things to know . . .

1. Don't forget to **send your child to school with a mask**. Everyone over 2 years of age should have their nose and mouth covered.
2. **Students riding the bus must keep their masks on** for the entire ride.
3. Please **do not send sick children to school**. We are making a gallant effort to keep everyone on campus healthy.
4. Don't forget your **child's immunizations** need to be maintained, especially during this pandemic. Young people from 2 months to 18 years have shots that have to be taken to stay in school.
5. **Flu shots** will certainly be needed this year. It is very difficult to distinguish between COVID-19 and the flu. The best time to receive it is September and October.
6. **Vitamin D is a great source to ward off illnesses**. It helps to regulate the amount of calcium and phosphate in the body. These nutrients are needed to keep teeth, muscles, and bones healthy. Foods like cheese, eggs, dairy products, orange juice, tuna, mackerel, and salmon are great sources. Fifteen minutes daily in the sun will also do the trick. ###



NOLA-PS Returning to Traditional Instruction for 2021-22

New Orleans Public Schools decided that the 80 charter schools will be holding classes in the traditional setting of the classroom for all grade levels. Remote or virtual learning will only be offered for special circumstances due to health issues or if students are ordered to quarantine.

NOPS educates 45,000 students. At the close of last school year (May 21), about 20-30% of elementary and middle school scholars were still in the virtual mode of learning. About 50% of high schoolers were being educated remotely.

Warrior parents should prepare to send their scholar to campus in August, in complete uniform with mask daily. Vaccines are available for students 12 and over.

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

