Karen LeBlanc became our librarian, replacing Sarah Wilson.

Linda Ducros, Sonya Dent, N'Daria Allen graced our classrooms as second teachers—paraprofessionals that are another pair of hands, eyes, and hearts for the young ones under their care.

Valerie Wimberly arrived as an assistant secretary to Mrs. Batiste-Johnson. The next year, she became the paraprofessional in the Pre-K classroom and has been the “second educator” there since.

Terri Daigle, Seané Taylor-Allen, Arriane Jones, and Shawn Tolliver were also the ‘new kids on the block’ in August 2011. **Daigle** was an exceptional 5th grade teacher. Her

first year on campus, she was selected **Teacher-of-the-Year** by her peers.

Seané Taylor-Allen came to us as a middle school math teacher. Knowledgeable about her subject, with great classroom discipline, she easily caught the attention of the school’s administration and has since become an Instructional Coach.

Arriane Jones arrived a decade ago as a classroom teacher instructing elementary pupils. By the 2019-2020 academic year, her peers had chosen her Teacher-of-the-Year for her work as a social studies and science teacher.

For about 20 years, **Shawn Tolliver** has been an early childhood educator. Luckily for FCW, she has spent half of her career here on Dwyer. Arriving on campus from

neighboring Sarah T. Reed, Tolliver and fellow Pre-K educator Ashley Singleton, has turned the program at FCW into one that has been assessed by the Louisiana Department of Education (LDE) as one of the city’s desired places for Pre-K (4) students.

Jacqueline Edmond, a graduate of Dillard U (B.S.) and LSU (Master’s), is our last dedicated educator on the list. She has been a guidance counselor for over 19 years, 10 of those years here at Fannie. Edmond’s curiosity serves her well when asking probing questions during her counseling sessions.

Thanks to all our dedicated educators who have worked tirelessly to make Fannie a great place for pupils to learn and grow.

Principal's Message



December 1, 2021

Dear Parents/Guardians,

I am pleased to inform you that our charter renewal has been granted!

FCWCS had its beginning under the Recovery School District, during the 2007-2008 school year. It opened on the site of the former Fannie C. Williams Middle School. In December of 2011, Community Leaders Advocating Student Success (C.L.A.S.S.) was granted a charter by the State of Louisiana. Our first academic year as a charter was 2011-2012.

Charter schools receive a 5-year contract initially and if they pass that first review they are able to apply for a renewal. Renewal contracts can last anywhere between three and 10-years. **Our renewal has been granted for an additional three years.**

This opportunity provides us additional time to impact positively the children of our learning community. **We can only do this if your child is present and prompt each day of school week.** We have begun an initiative to get Warriors here everyday and on time (*see pg. 8*). Please help us to improve attendance and thus achievement in the classroom.

I would also like to address a few other matters: 1. TikTok, 2. face masks, 3. water, and 4. vaccinations:

TikTok is an app that has become very popular with middle and high school students. Go on Facebook and Instagram and both sites will be filled with user-created videos. **The use of challenges and hashtags to engage adolescents in negative behavior has become a problem for schools nationwide.**

The challenges have evolved into school property destruction and physical violence against other

students and school staff. It is always filmed and then posted online. **FCWCS will not tolerate violence and destruction of school property. Students will be disciplined according to school rules and regulations regarding destruction of school property and violence.**

Parents and students are reminded that all phones are to be turned in to homeroom teachers immediately each morning. They are returned at the end of the school day.

Masks are worn by everyone on campus at FCWCS in accordance with NOLA-PS mandates. Please make sure your child has a mask on while riding the school bus or exiting your vehicle in the morning. We would appreciate it if you ensure that your Warrior has a spare mask in their book bag each day.

All water fountains have been turned off since the start of the pandemic. Please send your scholar to school with a bottle or two of water each day.

Vaccinations have been approved for all students from ages 5 and older. Therefore, all students (except Pre-K who are 4 are eligible for vaccinations). Please consider having your Warrior vaccinated against COVID and the flu. Let's keep everyone on campus healthy and safe.

The Board of Directors (C.L.A.S.S.) and the school's administration appreciates the confidence you have placed in our team of educators to provide a positive learning environment for your child.

The Administration, Staff, and Board of Directors are hoping that the holidays are a happy, healthy, and safe one for you and your family.

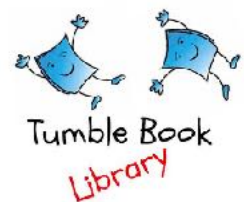

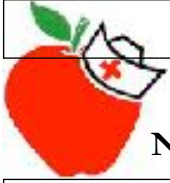

FDA Gives OK for Vaccinations for Children and Teens



The Federal Drug Administration has recently given the okay to vaccinations children from 5 through the teen years. That means **Warriors from kindergarten through 8th grades can now receive the shot.**

On November 18th, our campus hosted a flu and COVID-19 shots session by the Health Hero Team. Consent forms were sent home in the Wednesday Folder. **Mrs. Batiste had to send out a Class DoJo message and a robo call to get forms back.** Please take advantage of vaccinations when offered at school for your convenience. We need everyone doing their part to keep our campus safe.



Measles Returning?

The USA has kept measles at bay for almost two decades. However, doctors are hoping there will not be a return to this childhood disease in our future.

During the Pandemic, medical providers have found that children are not receiving their childhood immunizations as they should. Measles still exist in other parts of the world, therefore making it possible for travelers to bring it into our country. Parents must continue to have their children immunized against measles and other childhood diseases (*cont'd on pg. 5*).

It's Tuesday, 8:45am and PAFFORD MEDICAL SERVICES Are Here

Every Tuesday morning since September, a crew of four make their way to the Warrior Café.

They carry two I-Pads, a large box, boxes of disposable blue gloves, and various other items needed to test the staff and students (with parental consent) for the virus called SARS-CoV-2 or COVID-19.

We've gotten to know the staff from PAFFORD Medical Services, a friendly group usually composed of one male and three females. They quickly set up, using two tables. The first one is for check-in and the tubes needed for the swabs.. The second table is manned by two testing techs in scrubs and protective clothing, hundreds of plastic

specimen bags and a cooler to hold the test tubes for their trip to the lab.

During their three hour stay, they log in and test about 300 members of the staff and student body—all done with the efficiency of a well-oiled machine. I observed this team finish their important task on Tuesday, November 16th. These individuals are providing the much needed service of COVID testing on campus. It helps to provide "peace of mind" to parents and school staff.

Experts agree that the best way to prevent the spread of the virus is to test often. If your student is not registered for testing, please consider it. Use the info below and register once and you're done! ###

Fear of Measles (cont'd from pg. 4)

When measles come into a community that has a high percentage of vaccinated population, outbreaks are usually very small or don't occur. The ability to maintain such a small incident of measles the last 20 years is considered a monumental public health achievement.

Protect your child against measles, mumps, chicken pox, polio, small pox, etc. by having them vaccinated according to the CDC (Center for Disease Control) guidelines.

Measles can be deadly, especially for the very young (children younger than 5 years), adults over 20 years of age, pregnant women, and individuals with comprised immune systems (HIV infection or leukemia, for example). It is highly contagious and can lead to serious complications, usually one to two weeks after children have been infected.

Often thought of as just a rash, you should look for the following as it begins . . .

- high fever (up to 104 °),
- cough,
- runny nose,
- watery, red eyes.

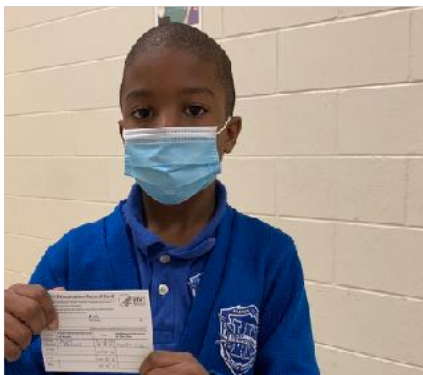
Individuals developing severe complications (pneumonia, lung infections and encephalitis). About 1 in 5 unvaccinated people in the U.S. who get measles will have to be hospitalized. Very severe cases can result in death.

Keep measles away, have your child vaccinated (2 doses) for childhood diseases according to the immunization schedule.

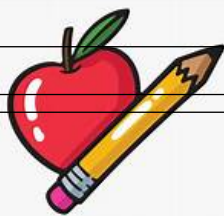

Faculty Members to Know

This column is the seventh in a series about the educators who teach and supply support services at FCWCS.

Monique Brierre Aziz School Social Worker

According to the federal government's *Occupational Outlook Handbook*, "social workers help people solve and cope with problems in their everyday lives." That description certainly describes our school's social worker, Mrs. Monique B. Aziz.

That mask hides a pleasant face, complete with one dimple. Enter her office, have a seat and the world's greatest listener appears. You instantly feel that you can share just about anything with this woman and not fear it will be repeated—call her trustworthy. You will also be aware of a phone that rings with frequency. People needing help know this is the person to reach out to—our Mrs. Aziz.

Mrs. Aziz is in her sixth year at Fannie and her 41st year as a social worker. She was born in Haiti's capital city Port-au-Prince. Raised in Shreveport, Louisiana by her father (a physician) and homemaker mother in a family of four children (two brothers and one sister).

She was educated at St. Vincent's Academy (Shreveport), where she was involved in the choir, softball team, marching squad, and the newspaper staff. College at Boston University found Monique pledging Zeta Phi Beta Sorority. She found time to be a Brownie Troop Leader and join the Big Sisters/Big Brothers Association (she was a Big Sister, mentoring young girls). She earned a Bachelor's in Sociology. Returning to BU, a Master of African-American History and a Master of Social Work was added to her stellar academic credentials. She moved to New Orleans 35 years ago and during her employment at FCWCS, she has found time to earn a Master of Museum Studies from Southern University at New Orleans (SUNO).

The love of African American history was definitely inspired by her parents, who were very active in the Civil Rights Movement of the 1960s, particularly the integration of Catholic Schools in Shreveport. Monique and her siblings were the first African American children to integrate the Catholic Schools in Shreveport. That experience shaped how she viewed and interacted with others all of her life. "We must be kind and share that kindness with all," says Aziz.

Just who were Aziz's influencers in her life? "I believe that my parents were the biggest influencers in my life. They were immigrants, who believed in education and taught us to always be of service to others and to our community." Their daughter has been inspired to live by her father's motto—"Man's Humanity to Man." Be of service everyday of your life to others.

"Spare time is spent cooking, baking, sewing (lately making quilts), reading and gardening. She is a wife and mother to one adult son.

"I absolutely love being a School Social Worker, especially at FCW. The students and staff are truly "family"! . . . I feel honored to be a part of such a special place that is preparing young people to become independent, productive citizens of New Orleans and the world."

Mrs. Aziz we're honored to have you on staff!

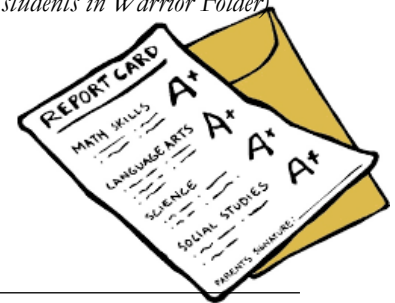

NOLA Public Schools (NOLA-PS) open enrollment began November 1st for the 2022-23 school year.



Formerly called OneApp, it is now called the Common Application Process (NCAP). This is the process that allows families to apply for your high school for next year. **The Main Round period is from November 1st to January 21, 2022.**

Families have 12 weeks to apply. Once the Main Round period closes, matches will begin. All 76 NOLA-PS affiliated schools are now linked to this program. So families wishing to apply to Lusher and/or Benjamin Franklin will use this process. Go to **enrollnolaps.com** and click **Enroll** on the home page to begin. ###

Weekly Testing Incentives @ FCWCS

Each time a student is tested, they earn a payment. The virtual card will be reloaded with that amount. Testing pays off, for a safer, smarter school. All participants in Tuesday's testing are eligible.

Payments will be uploaded to the cards at the end of every month.

- For the first test of the year (in September), students received \$25.00.
- For every test taken after the first payment, participants will receive \$10.00.

Incentives for Students:

The first registration process must be handled on line through the Color system. Parents or legal guardians must grant their approval for students under 18 years of age. Virtual payments will be delivered to the email address provided by parents/guardians during registration.
